The following is a checklist to help you organize your senior year:

ACTION PLAN: HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS

FALL

Pulling Your Applications Together

- Narrow your list of colleges to between 5 and 10. Get an application and financial aid info. From each. Visit as many as possible.
- Make a master schedule and note: test dates, fees, and deadlines; college application due dates; required financial aid applications and their deadlines; recommendations, transcripts, and other necessary materials.
- Ask for recommendations. Fill out a BRAG SHEET or resume, and provide to each person, along with a stamped, addressed envelope.
- Write application essays and ask teachers, parents, and friends to read first drafts.

Applying Early Action or Early Decision?

For early admissions, colleges may require test scores and applications in early NOVEMBER. Send your SAT scores at collegeboard.com

WINTER

Application Details

- Most regular applications are due between January 1 and February 15. Keep copies of everything you send to colleges.
- Order official transcripts from Mrs. Broker in the counseling office for \$3.00 per copy.
- Contact colleges to make sure they've received all application materials.

FINANCIAL AID: Apply Early. Apply Right.

- Submit your FAFSA as soon after January 1st as possible at fafsa.ed.gov.
- Men 18 or older must register for Selective Service before receiving any assistance.
- Many priority financial aid deadlines are in February. Apply on time and keep copies of everything you send.



The Martin High School Theatre Department is doing something different! This year, two fall productions will merge together and show back to back for a laughter filled week celebrating the playwriting prowess of Neil Simon. THE ODD COUPLE and THE ODD COUPLE (FEMALE VERSION) are two separate plays. Right now, they are being rehearsed with two separate casts who take turns using the Little Theatre stage as they prepare for performances in November.

THE ODD COUPLE first opened on Broadway in 1965 and swept the Tony awards in acting, directing, and set design. Playwright Neil Simon won the Tony award for best playwright, leading to an Oscar for best screenplay when he adapted the popular play into a movie in 1968. He also won an Emmy award when the hit TV series was added to the list of successes in 1970. The script was so popular that in 1985, after popular demand, Simon adapted the all male script of best friend poker players into a circle of women, who had known each other since high school, convening for Trivial Pursuit.

THE ODD COUPLE is so frequently produced by high schools, colleges, and professional theatres that it's considered to be a comedic American classic. The characters lead to great study for sixteen Martin Theatre students under the direction of both Larry Cure for the female version and Sharon Miller for the original script. Students will design and construct a versatile set which can be shared by both productions.

Tickets will go on sale the first week in November in the Little Theatre lobby and in Rm 260A. Audiences are encouraged to see the department's finest talent by attending both productions. Tickets are \$10 each. THE ODD COUPLE opens Thursday, November 12 at 7p.m. Additional performances are Friday the 13th, twice on Saturday the 14th, Monday the 16th, and Tuesday the 17th.
